If + present simple, present simple If + S+ $\underline{v.1}$, S + $\underline{v.1}$

You use this conditional when you want to talk about facts.

 \heartsuit If the wind <u>blows</u>, the trees <u>move.</u>

 \heartsuit If the weather <u>is</u> hot, the ice <u>melts.</u>



I <u>don't sleep</u> at night if I <u>drink</u> coffee after 3 PM.





If + present simple, future simple If + S+ $\underline{v.1}$, S + $\underline{will + v.inf}$

You use this conditional when you want to talk about possibility or probability.

♥ If we <u>don't leave</u> soon, we <u>will miss</u> our train.

♥ If I<u>'m</u> late for work again, I <u>might lose</u> my job.

♥ If Tom <u>studies</u> hard, <u>he'll pass</u> the exam.



If + past simple, would + v.inf If + S+ $\underline{v.2}$, S + \underline{would} + v.inf

You use this conditional when you want to talk about your imagination or unreal hypothetical present.

🎔 If I <u>had</u> 10 cars, I <u>would give</u> you one. 👀



 \heartsuit I <u>would buy</u> a mansion if I <u>won</u> the lottery.

♥ If I <u>were</u> shorter, I <u>would wear</u> heels more.







If + past perfect, would + v.inf If + S+ <u>had + v.3</u>, S + <u>would + have + v.3</u>

You use this conditional when you want to talk about something that is opposite to what happened in the past.

If you <u>had called</u> me, I <u>would have picked</u> you up.

If I had studied harder, I would've passed my

exam.
